



THE PROBLEM




Impact of covid-19

ANALYZING THE INTERVIEWS

Typical day



- · Very busy, hectic schedule
- No free time
- Most participants prefer morning routine
- · Weekdays are usually reserved for schoolwork and
- classes, weekends are personal time
- · Sometimes part-time work
- · Online vs in person schedules are very different
- · Online classes allow for a more flexible/easy schedule
- During pandemic, new challenges came up when shifting to fully remote learning
- Shirting to fully remote learning
- Before pandemic there were lots of group meetings
- · Interaction with people changes weekday vs weekend

Communication & Collaboration




- In-person is much easier to communicate, can read body language and other non verbal cues
- · Remote meetings are easier to schedule
- Remote meetings generally take longer and more difficult to get point across.
 Tech challenges, and no non-verbal cues etc.
- Instant messaging preferred versus email
- · Common tools include Figma, zoom, slack, and sometimes whatsapp
- · Too much screen time can be overwhelming/tiring

Comparing Online vs In-person



- Remote classes offer flexibility with your schedule (rolling out of bed before class, scheduling is easier...)
- Fasier to make connections in person
- · In person leads to a sense of community and contentment
- · Remote classes can be very distracting. Concern over looks, browsing other sites, etc.
- Engagement levels are different online vs offline. (More self-conscious online, online feels like like you're in the spotlight. One said she feels like you have to respect teacher more in person.)
- Harder to process and retain information online
- Time saved with remote classes (traveling, getting ready etc)
- · In person conversations leads to deeper understanding


Integrate relationship building into the course structure

- More group projects
- Required social events for students
- A class dedicated to learning from others



Retain remote learning, but most classes should be in-person

- Majority of courses should be in person with 1 or 2 remote courses to allow students flexibility in their schedule
- Fewer "video on" rquirements to reduce zoom fatigue



Networking as a part of the curriculum

- Each class has at least one visiting guest lecturer that can influence and connect with students
- Job fairs are only in person and more frequent
- Students encouraged to meet/collaborate with those in other departments



Develop and maintain teacher and student relationships

- Required ongoing 1:1s with professor
- Proactively make sure students are on track and progressing well
